

Artificial Intelligence will transform the nature of work and nearly all aspects of the American economy. It will also have immense implications for national and international security.

As part of an ongoing <u>AI initiative</u> with the Bipartisan Policy Center, Reps. Will Hurd (R-TX) and Robin Kelly (D-III) will introduce a bi-partisan resolution in September to outline a national AI strategy.

This resolution builds on a series of convenings facilitated by the Bipartisan Policy Center that included expert stakeholders from business, academia, civil society and government.

The resolution will:

- * Recognize bi-partisan accomplishments in AI policy, by highlighting the accomplishments of the Obama and Trump administrations
- ❖ Assert Congress' critical role in establishing national priorities, funding scientific research and development, supporting emerging technologies, and sustaining cooperation with our allies
- ❖ **Identify** the need for a comprehensive strategy to retain global leadership in AI
- **Propose** four pillars to guide that strategy:
 - Workforce: The United States could lead in an AI-driven economy by filling the AI talent gap and preparing American workers for the jobs of the future, while also prioritizing inclusivity and equal opportunity
 - o **National Security:** The United States, in collaboration with partners and allies, must prioritize the development and adoption of AI technologies across the defense and intelligence apparatus
 - o **Research and Development:** The federal government must collaborate with the private sector and academia to ensure America's innovation ecosystem leads the world in AI
 - Ethics: The rise of AI technology has great potential to improve quality of life for Americans, but it must also be developed and used in a way that is ethical, reduces bias, promotes fairness, and protects privacy

Corresponding white papers on AI's implications for the <u>workforce</u>, <u>national security</u>, <u>R&D</u> and <u>ethics</u> offer actionable recommendations for the federal government to implement the pillars outlined in the resolution.
